# HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

We have been proud to be involved in the St John's Ambulance Restart a Heart programme since it started 10 years ago. If someone has a heart attack it is essential that they receive assistance quickly. The Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Yorkshire, Stan Hardy visited the school on Monday as it was the tenth anniversary. The Lord Lieutenancy is a ceremonial post and they are the King's representative in Yorkshire – the organisation has supported Restart a Heart from it's inception. Stan Hardy spoke to some of our Year 7 students and told them about one of his friends whose life was saved by the quick actions of a 14 year old cadet. Stan's friend collapsed at a memorial service and the 14 year old who had been trained in Restart a Heart ran over and started doing CPR. He saved the man's life. We are pleased that we are training our students in the hope that they never have to use this skill, but are giving them the confidence to use it should an emergency arise.



#### October Half Term






## **YEAR 10**




W/c 4th December Year 12 & Year 13 Assessment #1 (Year 12 classroom based & Year 13 trial exams - Hall)
