

Potential parking restrictions on or around 12th October on Mount Pleasant Road

We have been contacted by Northern Gas Networks regarding potential disruption to parents and carers dropping students off and collecting on or around the 12th October. Please see full information below from Northern Gas Networks:

"You may be aware, Northern Gas Networks are carrying out some gas mains replacement works in the area.



On or around 12th October, our works will move onto Mount Pleasant Road for approximately three weeks. We will then move onto The Lanes and Grange View for a further two weeks to finish the works in that area.

We have been informed that parents may drop students off around this area, we do not expect to have any traffic management on these streets however parking may be restricted and therefore difficult at busier times.


All students with an interest in History are welcome and each session will be an individual indepth study of a period, individual or event. So, even if you cannot make it to all of them, still come along to those you can!


Leeds Young Research Owls


YEAR 9




