HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE


I held a whole school assembly earlier this week to talk to the students about the tragic event which took place in Horsforth earlier this week in which a 15 year old boy was killed. I emphasised that whilst we should not speculate about the matter there is one aspect which we could be certain of. It is clear that a moment of extreme violence has resulted in an event which has led to a boy losing his life and will significantly affect many people, including the families and friends of both the victim and the person who did it, for the rest of their lives.

On a more positive note, we had two distinguished visitors into the school this week to talk to the students. On Thursday we had a visit by the Lord Mayor of Leeds, Councillor Al Garthwaite, who talked to our Year 8 students about her life and the causes which she has championed. The role is apolitical, but Councillor Garthwaite represents the Labour Party in Headingley. Earlier today we welcomed Stuart Andrew who is the Conservative MP for Pudsey. Mr Andrew addressed our Sixth Form students and took questions from them. Once it was finished Mr Andrew commented to me on how impressed he was with the student knowledge of and interest in current affairs.

Finally, Pudsey Parish Church and the Royal British Legion held a Remembrance service for local schools at Pudsey Cenotaph this morning which I attended with two of our Year 8 students representing the school. As you know, some of our former pupils were killed in both world wars so it was important to attend this event to remember them and the millions more who lost their lives. The Reverend Dimery who is the Vicar of Pudsey Parish Church asked that I mention the Field of Remembrance which is in the Churchyard and contains 2200 wooden poppy crosses. The main Pudsey Civic Act of Remembrance is on Sunday when the parade gets to Pudsey Parish Church at 9.45am for a 10am service followed by the Act of Remembrance and silence at the Cenotaph. I know that many of our students are in the cadets and will be involved on Sunday.


Extra-Curricular Updates
