End of term arrangement



Parents Evening



Equipment

I just wanted to remind parents that if students are missing equipment they can purchase from the Library or get the basics from their Form tutors in the morning. Some students are turning up to school without their bags.

All students should ensure that they have the following basic equipment for use in all lessons:
