## Industrial Cadets Work Experience – Year 11, 12 and 13

Work experience at Yorkshire Water is offered via our Industrial Cadets Work Experience programme. Industrial Cadets is an accredited work experience programme for young people, supported by the Engineering Development Trust (EDT).

During a week-long programme of activities, starting 8<sup>th</sup> July 2024, students will be based at the Learning Academy at Esholt Hall, Bradford. They will take part in a series of sessions learning about sustainability issues within the UK water industry. Students will be given a project to complete and present by the end of the week. This focuses on water conservation, which is a real challenge faced by the UK water industry.

At the end of the week, students will receive a nationally recognised Silver Level Industrial Cadets award. This is similar to receiving a Duke of Edinburgh Award, but with a focus on Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM). Students can therefore use this award when applying for jobs / further education.





#### Important Dates



Year 13 Trial Assessment Week commences Monday 4<sup>th</sup> December. Students only need to attend their timetabled exams and coursework sessions. However, if students would like to work in school they are welcome to use the Post 16 study area (as long as they sign in and out at reception/with Mrs Scott).

Exams will take place in the Dance Studio. Students with access arrangements will be in a separate room. Seating plans will be displayed outside the Dance Studio.

## Exam Expectations

- Students must arrive on time and properly equipped
- They should ensure their phone is turned off and out of sight in their bag placed in the trolley
- All outdoor clothing (coats & hats) should be placed in the trolley with their bag
- Smartwatches should be away in their bag
- All resources must be in their bag
- If a student has finished, they need to sit silently and wait to be told they can leave
- Students may not leave to go to the toilet unless they have a medical pass therefore they should go prior to the exam
- Students must not communicate with other students
- Students must complete all work on the exam paper





Support will continue to be offered to students who wish to apply to UCAS. Once students have had their application and personal statement checked, they need to make an appointment with Mrs Smith to complete the application.

Year 12 Assessment Week #1 will take place in classrooms during normal timetabled lessons. Students should know when their assessment will take place and expectations regarding how to prepare/content.

Summer 2023 GCSE certificates are now available to be collected from our Main Reception. Students can collect between 3.00-4.00pm and will need to sign/date on collection. These are very important documents and therefore students should keep them safe.
