HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

I was reminded earlier this week of the excellent opportunities we provide for our students. We are one of only 80 schools across England which teach Mandarin Chinese. We started the project five years ago and the first cohort are about to sit their GCSE Mandarin in May next year. The programme is designed to teach the subject to Year 7 and 8 students with a residential in China for two weeks at the end of Year 9. Unfortunately, due to the global pandemic, we have not had the opportunity to visit China. However, the visit is going ahead this summer in July. The British Council is organising it and this means we are participating in the largest co-ordinated foreign school trip in the world. 1000 students will be hosted in ten separate Chinese cities and will be taught about Chinese culture, history and get the opportunity to test their language skills throughout the two weeks. It will be the trip of a lifetime for the students.

Equipment

Equipment

- A French dictionary
- A reading book.




Year 13 Prom

**Leeds Futures - What is Leeds Futures?

Leeds Futures is a national outreach programme designed for individual learners in Year 12. The programme consists of a mixture of (mainly) online and in-person activities throughout Year 12 until the point of submitting their UCAS application in Year 13. Leeds Futures is free of charge and priority is given to applicants who meet certain widening participation criteria. The programme provides students with the opportunity to learn more about a subject area they are interested in pursuing at university, whilst developing their study skills and careers awareness. Students attend a variety of subject-related activities alongside receiving advice and guidance on practical matters such as UCAS applications, accommodation choices and student finance.
