HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

It is good to see the daylight hours increasing but the weather is clearly turning colder now. We always aim to keep the school open if we have significant snowfall but the main issue is that many of our staff travel from outside the area and the usual UK roads chaos which ensues after a heavy snowfall can stop them getting in on time or at all. This creates a safeguarding issue as the school now has over 1300 students and it is essential that we can supervise them all safely with an appropriate number of staff. Unfortunately, heavy snowfall can, on rare occasions, mean that we have to close the school or open slightly later to allow staff time to travel here.

If the school does close due to snow we send all parents a text message as soon as the decision is made (usually around 6.30am – 7am) so that families can make alternative arrangements if necessary for younger students. The information is also put onto our website and sent to Leeds City Council who also publicise any school closures.

Hopefully we will escape the end of the colder weather without a heavy snowfall but I thought it worth mentioning so that you know the process.



Project Shield - Parental Sessions 9th February - 20th February

The Knife Angel, an 8m metal sculpture made from 100,000 knives is at Leeds Royal Armouries through February. Its presence highlights ongoing work to keep all young people safe from weapons and to nurture their awareness. Last month students in KS3 worked with St Giles Trust in assembly to improve their knowledge of knife crime and the dangers of carrying any weapon.

English Literature GCSE
