### School Meals - Information Regarding Peanut Allergies

Chartwells (our catering provider) are currently following guidance from the Food Standards Agency (FSA) with regards managing students with peanut allergies.

The FSA is advising people who have a nut allergy to avoid consuming foods that contain or may contain mustard, mustard powder or mustard flour because they may be contaminated with peanuts. As a result of this, Chartwells are currently reviewing their products and are only able to provide a very restricted option for any students with a known peanut allergy. This includes:

Breakfast - Toast with margarine

Lunch - Jacket potato with plain tuna, beans or cheese with a plain salad (no dressing) and fruit

We fully appreciate that this is an incredibly restricted offer for any students with peanut allergies and we are working with Chartwells to have a full menu offer available as soon as possible to all students.
