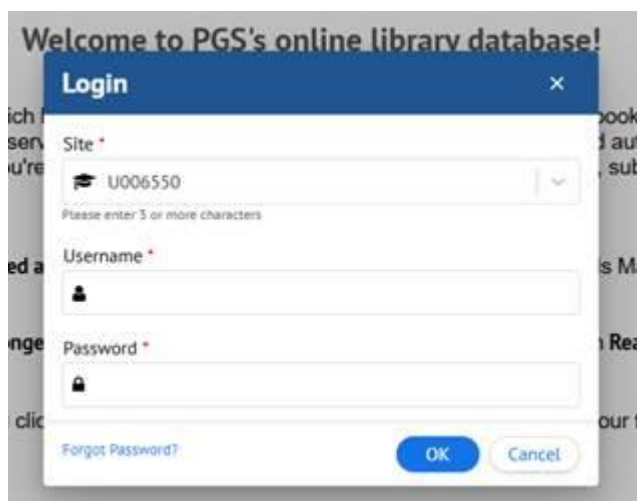


Borrowing eBooks through Reading Cloud

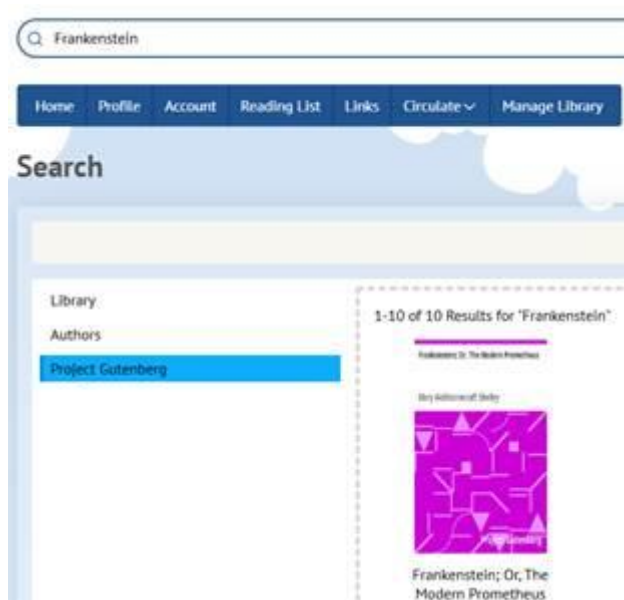

How to borrow eBooks through Reading Cloud

1. Log in to Reading Cloud.



2. Search up the eBook that you would like to borrow and click on the 'Project Gutenberg' option.



3. Select the resource that you would like to borrow and click on the yellow 'EPUB' icon. This will download the eBook.



4. Read your eBook! You will need EPUB reading software to do this.

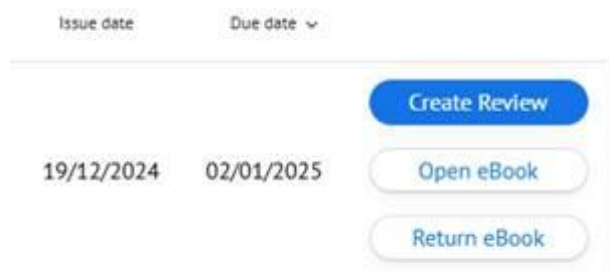
LETTER I.
