Process for borrowing ties/blazers

We would like to inform you about our ongoing efforts to support students who arrive at school without the correct uniform or necessary equipment by lending them what they need. We have found it necessary to tighten up our processes to ensure that borrowed items are returned promptly.

Starting from Tuesday 6th May, we will be introducing a new system to help manage this. If students need to borrow either a tie or blazer, they will be required to hand in their mobile phone. The mobile phone will be safely kept in exchange for the borrowed item. At the end of the school day, when the borrowed item is returned, the mobile phone will be given back to the student. We are confident that students will understand the rationale behind this decision and adhere to the terms of the new system. However, if a student does not comply with the new process, it will be necessary to enforce a sanction of isolation.

We appreciate that there may be situations where students need to communicate with their parents/carers during the day and they do not have their phone. In these circumstances the pastoral team/Year Leader will be happy to get in touch with parents/carers, if required.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation with this new process. Our aim is to ensure that students have the correct uniform and equipment while maintaining an efficient system for returning borrowed items.

Arbor Parent App Guide for Parents/Carers

The Arbor Parent App provides a convenient and intuitive way to access day-to-day school information at the touch of a button.



Key features include your child's:

- Timetable
- Homework
- ATL points (Attitude to Learning points). The app is great to track if your child is on target to reach those all-important ATL points and be eligible for end of year rewards.
- Behaviour record, including detentions
- Attendance. You can also log absences using the app.
- View your child's profile and update key information.

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome and you can download the Parent App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone or tablet.

Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have any questions about using the Parent App or the Parent Portal.

Here are some tips if you're having trouble logging in:

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor. You can ask us to check the email address linked to your account
- Reset your password from the login page
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. You can ask us to send a new one.
- Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice, for instance on another guardian's profile
- Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in
- Only relatives who are primary guardians of a child can access the Parent Portal or App

Important - To keep in touch with us you must keep logged in to Arbor In App to allow push notifications to come through to your screen.

iOS users will be prompted to receive push notifications when you download the app, ensure you select 'allow'.

You must enable push notifications to receive a notification when you have a new inapp message. If you do not enable this, you will not be alerted to a new message and may miss important information.
