# YEAR 8

## Year 8 HPV Immunisations

You should have received an email last week regarding the Year 8 Immunisations.

The School Immunisation Team will be visiting Pudsey Grammar School on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2025 to vaccinate the Year 8 students against HPV.

HPV, or the 'Human Papillomavirus' is a common virus that is spread through skin contact. The virus increases the risk of developing some cancers later in life, such as cervical cancer and some cancers of the mouth, throat, anal and genital areas. The evidence is clear that the HPV vaccine protects girls and boys from these HPV-related cancers.

### How to give consent

To go to the website, click on the following link, this will take you to the online HPV vaccination Intent form <u>https://bit.ly/3cmRlkr</u> and enter the code given below.

Or access the online consent form by typing the following words into your internet browser; 'Leeds Immunisations' The first result is the website from where you can access the HPV consent form.

Enter the unique school code for your child's school. The code for Pudsey Grammar School is **EE108079** (please ensure you enter all letters and numbers).

Important: If you do not wish your child to receive the vaccination, you are still required to complete the 'refusal section' on the form so that we understand your wishes. If we do not receive a consent or refusal form, your child will be given an opportunity to consent for themselves on the day after being assessed by a nurse as Gillick competent to do so.

Mathematics – Ratio, multiplicative change, fractions, graphs, data, probability, equations and inequalities, sequences, indices, percentages, standard form, angles, area, transformations, and averages.

Science - Solutions, acids and alkalis, respiration, reactivity, microbes, light, and sound.
