New Student Attendance Reward System - Starting This September!

We're excited to launch a new attendance reward system to celebrate and encourage excellent attendance at school.

Students will earn 1 point for every week of 100% attendance, as recorded in Arbor.

Points can be:

- Saved up for bigger prizes
- Exchanged for smaller rewards
- Traded for raffle tickets to win major prizes or for special events

There will be special double-points weeks



Students will continue collecting attendance stickers in their planners from Form Tutors – lost planners mean lost points.

Prizes will be available during lunch breaks from our Attendance Team. Details will be shared with students in September.

Appointments during the school day may affect AM/PM marks and could mean the week doesn't count – but students can always try again the next week.

We hope this new rewards system will help all our students aim high and come to school every day.

PE Information for September

Please see below a number of reminders regarding PE lessons at Pudsey Grammar School at the start of the September term.

PE kit

All students should have the following compulsory Pudsey Grammar School navy PE kit:

- -Pudsey Grammar School indoor navy sports polo top
- -Either the Pudsey Grammar School navy sports hoodie or rugby top
- -Studded football boots
- -Sports trainers

The following items are required for PE but can be non-Pudsey Grammar School branded:

- -Navy shorts or navy tracksuit bottoms or navy sports leggings (not tights)
- -Navy long socks

Students are not permitted to wear any other colour PE kit & students cannot wear cycling shorts or flares for PE as these are unsuitable for the sports they will be participating in.

If students are still waiting for new PE kit from Whittakers, please write a note in your child's school planner to clarify this. The full list of PE kit can be found on the school website:-

Non-participant notes

If a student cannot take part in a PE lesson, they should have a written note in their planner from a parent/carer unless it is a long-standing issue that school is aware of. If students have



the same injury for longer than a two-week period, a doctor's note should then be provided.

Students will still be expected to bring and wear their PE kit, even if they cannot take part, unless they cannot physically get changed. This is so they can still support the lesson in other ways and to prevent their school uniform from getting wet or dirty when they are outdoors with their PE group.

Extra-curricular

PE extra-curricular will start the week commencing 8th September. The extra-curricular clubs are open to all students in KS3 and KS4 and they run from 3.00pm-3.45pm. When attending the clubs, students will have to register using the PE QR code which is located outside the school changing rooms each time they attend.


Year 7

Have a great summer - we look forward to seeing you in September!


