It is good to see that our overall attendance figures have improved this year. As you know, students are regularly rewarded for having 100% attendance. The impact of missing a school day cannot be understated. Not only does the student miss the learning of that day. It means that when they come back, the work the class is then doing becomes even more difficult. As someone who taught maths for 30 years, I know that, with the best will in the world, if you have a class of 30 students and a couple of them missed the previous lesson, you simply do not have time to go back over that work in any detail. At best the student who has been absent will get a few minutes of your time to explain the previous 50 minute lesson.

Resilience is one of our core values so as we enter the winter where we are all more susceptible to seasonal illnesses, it's important that we continue to reinforce to students the importance of attending regularly, even if they do feel a bit under the weather.

Thank you for your support in this. A focus on good attendance will not only ensure that your child gets the most out of our school, but it also instills a resilience which will stand them in good stead when they leave school and enter their chosen career.

Please see the message for parents from the Education Safeguarding Team in Leeds:

Safeguarding Information: Children's "Spy" Books

We want to make you aware of a reports of a recent issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the Spy Dogs, Spy Cats, and Spy Pups series.

Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content.

The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

What this means for you:

If your child has any Spy Dog, Spy Cat or Spy Pups books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the sites.

It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves — the concern is only with the outdated link.

We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses in books without checking with an adult first.

If the matter is of an urgent nature, please do not hesitate to contact the main office.



OPPORTUNITIES

Reduced Entry to University of Leeds and more: Law, Criminology, Politics and History students!

Pathways to Law is a free two-year scheme for Year 12 students, run at the University of Leeds in partnership with the Sutton Trust. Designed to support students from backgrounds underrepresented in Law, the programme offers legal work experience with major firms, a residential conference, skills workshops, and tailored support with CVs and personal statements. Participants also benefit from guidance to help decide if Law is the right path for them and may be eligible for a two-grade reduction in entry requirements at participating universities including Leeds, Exeter, Warwick, and LSE. Applications are open now until 3rd November via the Sutton Trust website (Pathways to Law – Sutton Trust Pathways), with both in-person and online streams available. Applicants must be in Year 12 at a state school and should meet some of the following criteria: five GCSEs at grade 6 or above including English and Maths, first in family to attend university, receipt of Free School Meals, attending a school with below average attainment or progression, living in a low participation area (Please see Miss Robinson to find out if this applies to you), or having experience of being in care. The more criteria met, the stronger the application, though not all are required. The programme is open to students across subject areas, but may be of particular interest to those studying Law, Criminology, Politics, History or Sociology, or considering a career in Law.
