Careers in Pathology

In-person BTEC/A-Level Business Studies Work Experience Week

The Leeds Business Anchors Network is offering a dedicated week-long work experience programme for care-experienced young people, running from Monday 24th to Friday 28th November, 10.00am to 3.00pm each day, with a celebration event from 3.00pm–4.00pm on the Friday. Each day will be hosted by a different city-centre business, including GGI (technology consultants), Mott MacDonald (engineering), Burberry, Addleshaw Goddard (legal), and Leeds Building Society. The programme aims to give participants an introduction to a range of career options, a positive experience of professional workplace environments, and insight into apprenticeship and graduate opportunities within the Leeds Business Anchors network. This opportunity is open to care-experienced young people aged 16 and over who are currently studying at college, sixth form, or university and can commit to the full five days. NHS Health & Social Care Careers Webinar

Day one will focus on sustainability and the environment, with students working in small teams on a project brief to develop key skills and gain real-world experience. Day two will focus on apprenticeships, where Tetra Tech's HR team will introduce upcoming apprenticeship opportunities (opening this November), explain the application process, and share insights into what they look for in candidates. This placement is ideal for students interested in sustainable development and looking to get a head start on future apprenticeship applications.
