We would like to remind all families of the importance of students remaining in lessons for the full duration of every period. Full engagement in learning is essential for strong progress, and any missed time—whether at the start, middle or end of a lesson, can result in key content being lost.

As part of our school's behaviour system, teaching staff will continue to call home if a student is removed from a lesson. Your support with these conversations is vital in helping students understand the impact of their choices and in ensuring they remain focused throughout the school day. Moving forward, we are placing particular emphasis on students returning promptly and calmly after break and lunchtime, as removals during these times have a significant impact on learning.

In addition, we would like to reinforce the importance of students attending detentions when they are issued. Appropriate notice is always given so that families can make necessary arrangements, including ensuring students can travel home safely if it is dark. Detentions play



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an important role in maintaining high expectations and supporting students in meeting our behaviour standards.

Year 13 Parents Evening

Thank you for attending our virtual Parents' Evening on Thursday 22nd January. We hope you found the appointments useful, supportive, and informative as we move into these crucial final months of your child's education. Our next focus is the Year 13 Trial Exams that start Monday 9th March, and ensuring that students meet their coursework deadlines (further details to follow). If you have any further questions, or if there is anything we can do to support you or your child further, please do not hesitate to contact their form tutor or a member of the Post-16 team.

Year 12 Assessment Week – Monday 9th February

This is now only two weeks away and represents an important opportunity for students to demonstrate their knowledge, understanding, and progress in each of their subjects. These assessments are designed to:

- * Reflect students' current attainment against course expectations
- * Help teachers identify strengths and areas for development
- * Inform future teaching, support, and predicted grades
- * Prepare students for the demands of Year 13 and future examinations

Strong performance in Assessment Week is important, as it provides a clear indication of how well students are engaging with their courses and applying their learning under exam-style conditions.

Year 13 Leavers' Yearbook – Photo Submissions

An email was sent to Year 13 students earlier this week with details on how to sign up for the Year 13 Leavers' Yearbook and submit their photos. Students can upload their profile photo as well as many additional photos as they wish to be included in the extra pages of the yearbook. The deadline for submissions is Friday 23rd May. We encourage students to check their email and submit their photos as soon as possible to ensure inclusion.

Post-18 Apprenticeships – Information for Families

We would like to share some information about apprenticeships to help inform conversations at home for students who may be considering a post-18 apprenticeship after Year 13. As you may know, apprenticeships are paid job vacancies offered by employers, combined with additional education and training. This training might involve attending college one day a week or completing online learning modules alongside work. Apprenticeships can be found on many platforms, including individual employers' websites. There are also key apprenticeship search engines, including:



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*Find an Apprenticeship (GOV.UK)

*UCAS Apprenticeships (our recommended option)

*Indeed.com (using the apprenticeship filter)

Apprenticeships are available at different levels:

*Level 1-2: Equivalent to GCSEs

*Level 3 (Advanced Apprenticeship): Equivalent to A Levels

*Level 4-5 (Higher Apprenticeships): Between A Level and degree level

*Level 6 (Degree Apprenticeship): Degree-level, linked with a university

*Level 7-8: Master's/PhD level (requires completion of a Level 6 apprenticeship)

Students considering apprenticeships should be actively using search engines to explore current vacancies, paying close attention to application deadlines and start dates. Some apprenticeships are already being advertised with early deadlines for a September start. However, students should not be concerned if many opportunities appear to start soon; this usually means that the main recruitment period is around May and June for leavers securing roles after finishing Year 13. Apprenticeships are advertised all year round, and the more opportunities students apply for, the greater choice they will have when deciding their next steps after A Levels.
