GENERAL NOTICES

Behaviour System - Important Update

We are writing to inform you of an important update to our school behaviour system, which will come into effect from Monday 23rd February 2026. We are pleased to share that, since the introduction of our new Behaviour policy, the number of lesson removals has already decreased significantly, and students are consistently working hard in lessons.

We remain committed to improving these high standards even further so that all students can continue to learn in a calm and focused environment. From this point forward, if a student is removed from two lessons in the same day, this will result in a 90-minute detention being issued for the following school day.



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Class teachers and subject areas will continue to contact parents directly to discuss any removals from their individual subjects, as part of our ongoing commitment to strong communication and support.

If a student fails to attend the 90-minute detention set for two removals in a day, this will escalate to a full day in isolation, and the original 90-minute detention will then be completed after the day in isolation until it is concluded.

This change has been introduced with two clear aims. Firstly, it is intended to further reduce the number of lesson removals by encouraging students to remain in class and engage positively with their learning. Secondly, it supports our commitment to setting and maintaining high standards of behaviour, conduct and focus across the school, ensuring that all students can learn in a calm and purposeful environment.

We firmly believe that students learn best when they are present in lessons, fully participating and taking responsibility for their actions. This adjustment to our behaviour system is designed to reinforce these expectations and to help students make better choices that support both their own learning and that of others.

Parental support is key to further improvements in standards and behaviour, and we wish students to take responsibility for this. We appreciate your continued partnership in reinforcing our expectations and helping your child understand the importance of positive behaviour and consistent attendance in lessons.

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Y13 Trial Exams Friday 6th to Friday 13th March

The Year 13 trial exam timetable was shared with students during assembly today.

- Paper copies are available from the **P16 Office** and the **P16 Study Area**.
- An electronic copy has been added to **Arbor** and emailed to students.
- All information is also displayed outside the **P16 Office**.

Students studying **History, Criminology, Psychology, GCSE English and GCSE Maths** must check which option group they are in to ensure they attend the correct exam slot. This information is displayed outside the **P16 Office**, and students can also confirm details with their subject teacher.

During exam week, **both Year 12 and Year 13** students will sit papers, including **Core Maths, GCSE English, GCSE Maths and GCSE Science**.

Friday 6th March: Normal school day for all students unless they are timetabled for an exam.
