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## YEAR 11

If your child has selected Pudsey Grammar Sixth Form as their 1st or 2nd choice for September, they will receive a conditional offer letter over the weekend. This letter outlines the subjects they have been offered.

Please note: Offers are conditional upon your child's continued progress, good conduct, and Year 11 exam results. Good attendance is essential for academic success and will also be considered when awarding Sixth Form places.

What to do next:

1. Check the offer carefully.
2. Confirm acceptance or decline using the Google Form link/QR code provided at the bottom of the offer letter.
3. The form will also ask additional questions, such as whether PGS is your child's 1st or 2nd choice.
4. There is an option to request a follow-up meeting to discuss subject choices.

Subject selection guidance:

Students who have listed four subjects will have their choices reviewed closer to results day. We generally recommend selecting three subjects. If your child has been offered one or two subjects only, this reflects the subjects they expressed interest in during their interview. They will need to choose additional subjects at a follow-up meeting to confirm their full offer.

Important reminders:

Students can change their subjects if needed.

Students can change PGS from 2nd choice to 1st choice if desired.
